About REVEL:

Mission: REVEL is the bridge to adulthood for people with autism to live meaningful, enriched lives.

Vision: Life Without Limits

Purpose: Our purpose is to fight potential isolation, depression, unemployment, and risk factors related to quality of life. We do this by providing opportunities to teach critical skills that enhance the lives of teens and adults with autism encouraging them to reach their fullest potential.

Program Review:

REVEL impacts the autism community in the Denver metro area by creating opportunities that support each client on their individualized path towards independence. REVEL provides a comprehensive approach to supporting teens and adults with autism through behavior therapy, life skill development, employment support, and social emotional connections.

General Description:

REVEL is seeking a Mental Health Clinician to provide therapeutic services to neurodivergent teens and adults within community-based programming and individual sessions. This role will support individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDDs), autism, and co-occurring mental health needs through individual therapy, skill development, and collaboration with REVEL's interdisciplinary team.

In addition to clinical services, this position may eventually supervise graduate-level interns, helping expand REVEL's mental health services while mentoring emerging

clinicians.

Primary Objectives and Duties of The Job:

Clinical Services

- Provide individual therapy for teens and adults
- Address mental health needs including: Anxiety, Depression, Emotional regulation, Social relationships, Life transitions, Trauma-informed support
- Develop and maintain treatment plans and therapeutic goals.
- Utilize evidence-based practices such as:
 - Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT)
 - Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT)
 - Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT)
 - Social-emotional skill development
- Offer crisis intervention and safety planning when clients present with urgent needs.
- Facilitate group therapy or psychoeducational groups focused on social skills, emotional regulation, coping strategies, or life transitions.
- Provide family support sessions to strengthen communication and reinforce therapeutic goals at home.

Interdisciplinary Collaboration

- Collaborate with REVEL staff including: Program Directors, Direct Care Staff, BCBA's
- Provide consultation and recommendations to staff regarding participant mental health needs.
- Participate in team meetings or case consultations as needed.
- Provide staff training on various topics including:
 - Trauma-informed care
 - Behavior de-escalation
 - Supporting clients with social-emotional challenges
 - Self-care and burnout prevention
- Participate in case conferences, team meetings, or IEP/transition planning meetings when relevant.
- Communicate progress or concerns with families while maintaining confidentiality and ethical boundaries.

Documentation & Compliance

- Maintain timely clinical documentation including: Progress notes, Treatment plans, Assessments
- Track required outcomes, service hours, and client metrics for reporting and funding requirements.

Program Development

- Support the development of mental health services within REVEL programs.

- Provide occasional staff training on mental health topics relevant to neurodivergent individuals.
- Assist in developing or enhancing mental health curriculum, social-emotional programming, and skill-building modules for REVEL participants.
- Participate in organizational events, family workshops, or community engagement activities when needed

Experience Needed/Qualifications:

- At least a Master's degree in Clinical Mental Health Counseling, Social Work, Marriage and Family Therapy, or a related behavioral health field required.
- Active licensure as an LPC, LCSW, LMFT, Licensed Psychologist, or equivalent required.
- Experience working with individuals with a variety of mental health diagnoses
- Experience working with individuals with autism spectrum disorder and/or intellectual and developmental disabilities, preference in experience with adults
- CPR/First Aid certified or willing to become certified
- Trained in QBS safety care or willing to become trained
- Previous experience successfully managing staff and communicating with families
- Ability to build and maintain positive relationships with staff, mentors, community members, REVELers and parents
- Self-directed and follow through with tasks to produce measurable outcomes
- Reliable mode of transportation needed to drive to and from clients. Transporting clients during sessions may also occur requiring you to have a reliable vehicle and appropriate vehicle insurance coverage.
